# Love the Right Woman

**Proverbs 5:3–14** (NKJV) For the lips of an immoral woman drip honey, And her mouth is smoother than oil; <sup>4</sup>But in the end she is bitter as wormwood, Sharp as a two-edged sword. <sup>5</sup>Her feet go down to death, Her steps lay hold of hell.

**Proverbs 5:18–19** (NKJV) Let your fountain be blessed, And rejoice with the wife of your youth. <sup>19</sup>As a loving deer and a graceful doe, Let her breasts satisfy you at all times; And always be enraptured with her love. **Proverbs 31:10–11** Who can find a virtuous wife? For her worth is far above rubies. The heart of her husband safely trusts her; So he will have no lack of gain.

\*1 **Timothy 3:2** (NKJV) A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, sober-minded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach;

**Hebrews 13:4** (NKJV) Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge.

**Matthew 19:4–6** (NKJV) And He answered and said to them, "Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning 'made them male and female,' <sup>5</sup> and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? <sup>6</sup> So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate."

1 Corinthians 7:3–5 Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her, and likewise also the wife to her husband. <sup>4</sup> The wife does not have authority over her own body, but the husband does. And likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does. <sup>5</sup> Do not deprive one another except with consent for a time, that you may give yourselves to fasting and prayer; and come together again so that Satan does not tempt you because of your lack of self-control.

**Proverbs 15:27** (NKJV) He who is greedy for gain troubles his own house, But he who hates bribes will live.

**Proverbs 29:17** (NKJV) Correct your son, and he will give you rest; Yes, he will give delight to your soul.

#### **Correction With Love**

**Proverbs 10:17** (NKJV) He who keeps instruction is in the way of life, But he who refuses correction goes astray.

**Proverbs 23:13–14** (NKJV) Do not withhold correction from a child, For if you beat him with a rod, he will not die. <sup>14</sup> You shall beat him with a rod, And deliver his soul from hell.

\*Proverbs 3:12 (NKJV) For whom the Lord loves He corrects, Just as a father the son in whom he delights.

**Psalm 23:4** (NKJV) Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

**Hebrews 12:9–10** (NKJV) Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? <sup>10</sup> For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness.

**Deuteronomy 11:18–21** (NKJV) "Therefore you shall lay up these words of mine in your heart and in your soul, and bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. <sup>19</sup> You shall teach them to your children, speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. <sup>20</sup> And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, <sup>21</sup> that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land of which the Lord swore to your fathers to give them, like the days of the heavens above the earth."
