Gal 6:1–10, Matt 18:15–17, 1 Cor 10:12, Rom 15:1, John 13:34, Luke 22:3

Galatians 6:10 (ESV) *So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.*

Restoring the Fallen

Galatians 6:1 (NKJV) *Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.*

Job 4:3–4 (NKJV) *Surely you have instructed many, And you have strengthened weak hands. Your words have upheld him who was stumbling, And you have strengthened the feeble knees;*

James 5:19–20 (NKJV) *Brethren, if anyone among you wanders from the truth, and someone turns him back, ²⁰ let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save a soul from death and cover a multitude of sins.*

***Matthew 18:15** (NKJV) *“Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother.*

1 Corinthians 5:1–2 (NKJV) *It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you, and such sexual immorality as is not even named among the Gentiles—that a man has his father’s wife! And you are puffed up, and have not rather mourned, that he who has done this deed might be taken away from among you.*

The parable of the Good Samaritan.

Hebrews 6:4–6 (NKJV) *For it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted the heavenly gift, and have become partakers of the Holy Spirit, ⁵ and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, ⁶ if they fall away, to renew them again to repentance, since they crucify again for themselves the Son of God, and put Him to an open shame.*

Matthew 7:6 (NKJV) *“Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you in pieces.*

Beware of Temptation

Galatians 6:1 (NKJV) *...considering yourself lest you also be tempted.*

Thou Art The Man

2 Samuel 12:7 *“And Nathan said to David, Thou art the man” .*

Esther 7:5, 6 *So King Ahasuerus answered and said to Queen Esther, “Who is he, and where is he, who would dare presume in his heart to do such a thing?” And Esther said, “The adversary and enemy is this wicked Haman!” So Haman was terrified before the king and queen.*

Matthew 7:1, 2 (NKJV) *“Judge not, that you be not judged. ² For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you.*

Matthew 7:3–5 (NKJV) *And why do you look at the speck in your brother’s eye, but do not consider the plank in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, ‘Let me remove the speck from your eye’; and look, a plank is in your own eye? Hypocrite! First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother’s eye.*

Matthew 26:31-3 *Then Jesus said to them, “All of you will be made to stumble because of Me this night, for it is written: ‘I will strike the Shepherd, And the sheep of the flock will be scattered.’ ” But after I have been raised, I will go before you to Galilee.” Peter answered and said to Him, “Even if all are made to stumble because of You, I will never be made to stumble.” Jesus said to him, “Assuredly, I say to you that this night, before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times.”*

Daniel 4:22 *it is you, O king, ...*

***Matthew 26:25** *Then Judas, who was betraying Him, answered and said, “Rabbi, is it I?” He said to him, “You have said it.”*

Romans 2:21-24 *You, therefore, who teach another, do you not teach yourself? You who preach that a man should not steal, do you steal? You who say, “Do not commit adultery,” do you commit adultery? You who abhor idols, do you rob temples? You who make your boast in the law, do you dishonor God through breaking the law? For “the name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you,” as it is written.*

1 Corinthians 10:12 *Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall.*

1 Corinthians 11:31 (NKJV) *For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged.*

2 Cor 13:5 *Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?; unless indeed you are disqualified.*

2 Peter 3:17 *You therefore, beloved, since you know this beforehand, beware lest you also fall from your own steadfastness, being led away with the error of the wicked;*

Burden Bearing

Galatians 6:2–5 (NKJV) *Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.* ³ *For if anyone thinks himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself.* ⁴ *But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.* ⁵ *For each one shall bear his own load.*

Ivan Fredericks (1864–1904), known as Russian Jack, was a goldminer of the Western Australian gold rush in the 1880s. In 1885, while working in the Halls Creek goldmines, he pushed his sick friend in a wheelbarrow 150 miles through the Great Sandy Desert to Wyndham, the nearest town with a medical Center. A statue was erected to him in Halls Creek. He is buried in Fremantle Cemetery. Russian Jack is a famous figure in Western Australia.

***Matthew 27:32** (NKJV) *Now as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. Him they compelled to bear His cross.*

Matthew 5:41 (NKJV) *And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two.*

James 2:14–16 (NKJV) *What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him?* ¹⁵ *If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food,* ¹⁶ *and one of you says to them, "Depart in peace, be warmed and filled," but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit?*

Romans 12:15 (NKJV) *Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.*

Romans 15:1 (NKJV) *We then who are strong ought to bear with the scruples of the weak, and not to please ourselves.*

The Law of Christ

Matthew 22:34–40 (NKJV) *But when the Pharisees heard that He had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together.* ³⁵ *Then one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying,* ³⁶ *"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?"* ³⁷ *Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."*

John 13:34–35 (NKJV) *A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another.* ³⁵ *By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."*

Galatians 5:14–15 (NKJV) *For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."* ¹⁵ *But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another!*

Sowing and Reaping

Galatians 6:7–8 (NKJV) *Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.* ⁸ *For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life.*

***Job 4:8** *"According to what I have seen, those who plow iniquity And those who sow trouble harvest it.*

Proverbs 6:27–29 (NKJV) *Can a man take fire to his bosom, And his clothes not be burned? Can one walk on hot coals, And his feet not be seared? So is he who goes in to his neighbor's wife; Whoever touches her shall not be innocent.*

Romans 2:5–6 (NKJV) *But in accordance with your hardness and your impenitent heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,* ⁶ *who "will render to each one according to his deeds":*

Romans 8:5–6 (NKJV) *For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit.* ⁶ *For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.*

Matthew 26:41 *"Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."*

1Cor 3:1 *And I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ.*
