# Lesson #6 Oneness in Christ - "Images of Unity"

#### **Memory Verse**

**1 Corinthians 12:12** (*NKJV*) For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ."

**E Pluribus Unum** - The Latin words are the motto found on the Great Seal of the United States. It was originally chosen in 1776 by a committee of consisting of Benjamin Franklin, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, but not adopted officially by Congress until six years later (in 1782). The phrase E Pluribus Unum, of course, means "out of many, one" and refers to the idea that the United States is one nation consisting of several different states. Out of many, one nation.

### The People of God

**Deuteronomy 4:20** (*NKJV*) But the Lord has taken you and brought you out of the iron furnace, out of Egypt, to be His people, an inheritance, as you are this day.

**Deuteronomy 7:6–8** (*NKJV*) "For you are a holy people to the Lord your God; the Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth.<sup>7</sup> The Lord did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples; <sup>8</sup> but because the Lord loves you, and because He would keep the oath which He swore to your fathers, the Lord has brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you from the house of bondage, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

**1 Peter 2:9–10** (*NKJV*) But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light; <sup>10</sup> who once were not a people but are now the people of God, who had not obtained mercy but now have obtained mercy.

**Exodus 19:5–6** (*NKJV*) Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth is Mine. <sup>6</sup> And you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words which you shall speak to the children of Israel."

**Revelation 1:5–6** (*NKJV*) ... To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood, <sup>6</sup> and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

\*Revelation 20:6 (NKJV) Blessed and holy is he who has part in the first resurrection. Over such the second death has no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years.

### The Household of God

**Matthew 7:24** *Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock:* 

**Ephesians 2:19–22** (*NKJV*) Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, <sup>20</sup> having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone, <sup>21</sup> in whom the whole building, being fitted together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, <sup>22</sup> in whom you also are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

**1 Corinthians 3:9–11** (*NKJV*) For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building. <sup>10</sup> According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. <sup>11</sup> For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

**1 Peter 2:4–5** (*NKJV*) *Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious, <sup>5</sup> you also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.* 

# The Temple of the Holy Spirit

**2 Chronicles 7:1–2** (*NKJV*) When Solomon had finished praying, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the Lord filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> And the priests could not enter the house of the Lord, because the glory of the Lord had filled the Lord's house.

\*1 Corinthians 3:16–17 (NKJV) Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? <sup>17</sup> If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are.

**Romans 8:9** (*NKJV*) But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His.

**1 Corinthians 6:19–20** (*NKJV*) *Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?* <sup>20</sup> *For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.* 

## The Body of Christ

In the New Testament, the church is often described as the body of Christ. Yet for some reason it is becoming more and more common for Christians to amputate themselves from the body of Christ. Often I hear people ask, "Does it really matter if I go to church?" or "Can't I survive spiritually without the church?" and "Won't the church survive without me?" **Ephesians 1:22–23** (*NKJV*) *And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.* 

**Ephesians 4:4–6** (*NKJV*) *There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling;* <sup>5</sup> *one Lord, one faith, one baptism;* <sup>6</sup> *one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.* 

**1 Corinthians 10:17** (*NKJV*) For we, though many, are one bread and one body; for we all partake of that one bread.

**Ephesians 4:12** (*NKJV*) for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ,

**Romans 12:4–8** (*NKJV*) For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, <sup>5</sup> so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. <sup>6</sup> Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; <sup>7</sup> or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; <sup>8</sup> he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

**1 Corinthians 12:12–26** (*NKJV*) For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. <sup>13</sup> For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. <sup>14</sup> For in fact the body is not one member but many. <sup>15</sup> If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? <sup>16</sup> And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where would be the smelling?

<sup>18</sup> But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. <sup>19</sup> And if they were all one member, where would the body be? <sup>20</sup> But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. <sup>21</sup> And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." <sup>22</sup> No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. <sup>23</sup> And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unpresentable parts have greater modesty, <sup>24</sup> but our presentable parts have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it, <sup>25</sup> that there should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another. <sup>26</sup> And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it.

#### Sheep and Shepherd Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David

**Psalm 23:1–3** (*NKJV*) *The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters.* <sup>3</sup> *He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake.* 

\*Isaiah 40:11 (NKJV) He will feed His flock like a shepherd; He will gather the lambs with His arm, And carry them in His bosom, And gently lead those who are with young.

John 10:1–11 (NKJV) "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door, but climbs up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.<sup>2</sup> But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup> To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice; and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. <sup>4</sup>And when he brings out his own sheep, he goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. <sup>5</sup> Yet they will by no means follow a stranger, but will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers."<sup>6</sup> Jesus used this illustration, but they did not understand the things which He spoke to them.<sup>7</sup> Then Jesus said to them again, "Most assuredly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. <sup>8</sup>All who ever came before Me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not hear them. <sup>9</sup>I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture.<sup>10</sup> The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.<sup>11</sup> "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.

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
