



s an adventurous, rambunctious kid, I once tied a towel around my neck, pretending it was a flowing cape, and jumped off a rooftop. Why? I wanted to be like my hero Superman.

Someone once said, "Be careful the friends you choose for you will become like them." While I sadly never developed Superman's power of flight, try as I might, people really do need good heroes. We tend to imitate the people we look up to, and over time, we become more and more like them.

According to the dictionary, a hero is a person distinguished by his or her courage or ability, admired for his or her brave deeds, sacrifice, or noble qualities. RAHAB HERDOFFAITH

An Amazing Fact: The largest rope made from all-natural materials measured 823 feet long and 7 feet, 2 inches around. Made from rice straw, it was used for a game of tug of war by citizens of Uiryeonggun, South Korea, during the Righteous Army Festival on April 22, 2005. But even weighing an immense 120,000 pounds, it was still not as strong as the cord of genuine faith.

"By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they were encircled for seven days. By faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe, when she had received the spies with peace" (Hebrews 11:30, 31).

A Hero of Faith and Works

When addressing the link between faith and works, the apostle James mentions two people: "But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead? Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar? ... Likewise, was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works when she received the messengers and sent them out another way? For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also" (James 2:20, 21, 25, 26).

No one would be surprised to see James's reference to Abraham, the father of the faithful, but who would think to include Rahab the harlot? Yet in Hebrews 11, where Paul chronicles the heroes of faith, he writes, "By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they were encircled for seven days. By faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe, when she had received the spies with peace" (vv. 30, 31).

Two women are called on by name in Hebrews chapter 11—Sarah and the harlot Rahab. Did you know



that Rahab was one of the ancestors of Jesus mentioned in the first chapter of the New Testament? (Matthew 1:5). Furthermore, she was the great-grandmother of King David. Obviously, the story of Rahab deserves our serious consideration!

No Surprise Ambush

"Now Joshua the son of Nun sent out two men ... to spy secretly, saying, 'Go, view the land, especially Jericho'" (Joshua 2:1). Jericho was a crucial city in the conquest of Canaan, and it became the site of a beachhead battle to enter the Promised Land. When Joshua had surveyed Jericho with the 12 spies 38 years earlier, they noticed its massive, menacing walls looming up to heaven, but Joshua was not intimidated.


Jericho was situated near the Jordan, and the Canaanites could plainly see the nearly three million Israelites camped on the plain just across the river. The people in the city likely understood that their new neighbors intended to dispossess them and reclaim the land God had promised to their ancestors. They had heard how God miraculously delivered them from slavery in Egypt and parted the Red Sea for their escape. They had heard the stories of how the Israelites conquered other pagan nations. At night they

could see the glowing pillar of fire rising from the camp of Israel. By day they watched the pillar of cloud hover above the tabernacle, shading the camp from the desert sun while the people gathered the manna that had fallen from heaven the night before. No wonder the people of Jericho were anxious about Israel's presence across the river!

Unwelcome Visitors

Joshua told the spies to go view the land, especially Jericho. "So they went, and came to the house of a harlot named Rahab, and lodged there" (Joshua 2:1).

Now, don't think these spies went on a pleasure-seeking jaunt into the red-light district of Jericho. In these pagan cultures, big houses by the city gates would often serve as the city hotel for traveling caravans. Rahab and her family



operated one of these inns right on the wall where wayfaring travelers would pass. Often these establishments had a little extra emphasis on the "bed" available for the right price. That's how Rahab got her title.

So the spies came to Rahab's inn and lodged there. Evidently, perhaps because they dressed a little differently and talked to each other in low tones with foreign accents, other customers recognized them as Israelites and made a beeline to warn the king. "And it was told the king of Jericho, saying, 'Behold, men have come here tonight from the children of Israel to search out the country'" (v. 2). If Joshua is a type of Jesus, then the king of Jericho naturally represents the devil. Take note that the devil knows when God's messengers are invading his domain.

"So the king of Jericho sent to Rahab, saying, 'Bring out the men who have come to you, who have entered your house, for they have come to search out all the country.' Then the woman took the two men and hid them. So she said, 'Yes, the men came to me, but I did not know where they were from. And it happened as the gate was being shut, when it was dark, that the men went out. Where the men went I do not know; pursue them quickly, for you may overtake them' "(vv. 3–5).

Rahab's Risk

This is one of the acts for which Rahab is immortalized. Rahab lived in Jericho, and by allying herself with God's people, she was laying her life on the line. What made her do that? Jericho was situated on a main highway at the crossroads of three continents. People from many different religious backgrounds would stop at her hotel, and she would observe their peculiar customs. Yet none of these other religions had impressed her so deeply as the God of the Israelites.

In her heart, Rahab believed that the religion of Jericho was just as foolish and futile as the others of which she'd heard. All of her life she'd been hearing reports about how this nation of slaves had been saved from Egypt and of the hundreds of miracles they'd experienced. Any God who could do

such powerful things—and who loves His people that much—was the God Rahab wanted to serve!

I believe Rahab began praying to the God of Israel to spare her and her family from the certain impending judgment on Jericho. When the two spies came through, she believed it was the providential opportunity for which she had been praying, and she began to demonstrate her faith by action. It's what we are called to do when we accept Christ as our Savior.

When Rahab realized that her king intended to harm the spies, she found a perfect hiding place for them. "But she had brought them up to the roof and hidden them with the stalks of flax, which she had laid in order on the roof" (v. 6).

Flax was a plant of which the finer parts were used for making a soft linen cloth. The coarser parts of the plant were woven together into twine, and the twine was eventually braided together into rope. Like many in her day, Rahab probably had a little family business on the roof of dyeing cloth and cord. She specialized in red, just as Lydia was a seller of purple (Acts 16:14).

When the soldiers went out to search for the spies, the city gates were locked (Joshua 2:7). It didn't seem as if there was any escape for Joshua's spies; the Canaanites were swarming the city and countryside looking for them. These two Israelites had to trust their deliverance to a pagan prostitute. The Lord often uses humble instruments to do great things.

You might wonder how God could bless Rahab—after all, she lied, and lying is always a sin. However, the Bible record is faithful and records even the failings of God's people. (For instance, in 1 Samuel 19:12–17, David's wife Michal told her

father, Saul, that David was sick in bed and, in reality, she had let David out the window to save his life.)

Yes, Rahab was dishonest. She might not have known better at such an early stage in her experience with God. Yet her action came from faith in Him, and the Lord looked on her sincere heart. "Truly, these times of ignorance God overlooked" (Acts 17:30).

In the Bible, a woman represents a church, and Rahab is a symbol of God's church. Have there been times when God's church has been unfaithful? "When the LORD began to speak

by Hosea, the Lord said to Hosea: 'Go, take yourself a

wife of harlotry and children of harlotry, for the land has committed great harlotry by departing from the LORD'" (Hosea 1:2).

Unfortunately, God's church has a record of sometimes playing the harlot. As a baptized Christian, you are symbolically married to Jesus. You make vows when you commit your life to Him. If you turn from Him and deliberately follow the

temptations of the devil,

you are committing a form of

spiritual adultery.

The good news is that God
can forgive and change someone like
Rahab. She ended up being an ancestor

of Jesus. And if God can change the hearts of people like Rahab, He can change ours as well.

Making a Covenant

After Rahab diverted the soldiers, she returned to the roof to commune with her refugees. After expressing faith in the God of Israel, she said, "I beg you, swear to me by the LORD, since I have shown you kindness, that you also will show kindness to my father's house, and give me a true token, and spare my father, my mother, my brothers, my sisters, and all that they have, and deliver our lives from death" (Joshua 2:12, 13).

Rahab wasn't concerned just with her own salvation, but also with that of her family. This should be a characteristic of God's church. As soon as we say, "Lord, save me," our next prayer should be, "Lord, save my loved ones."

> "So the men answered her, 'Our lives for yours, if none of you tell this business of ours. And it shall be, when the LORD has given us the land, that we will deal

kindly and truly with you.' Then she let them down by a rope through the window, for her house was on the city wall; she dwelt on the wall. And she said to them, 'Get to the mountain, lest the pursuers meet you. Hide there three days, until the pursuers have returned. Afterward you may go your way'" (vv. 14–16).

A Visible Sign

What sign would be given to Rahab to assure her safety?

"So the men said to her: 'We will be blameless of this oath of yours which you have made us swear, unless, when we come into the land, you bind this line of scarlet cord in the window through which you let us down, and unless you bring your father, your mother, your brothers, and all your father's household to your own home'" (vv. 17, 18).

What line were they talking about? She had just lowered a red rope out the window, a scarlet cord, with which the men would safely descend from the high window to the ground outside the city. And unless the red rope was hanging from her window when the Israelites came to conquer the city, no one in her house would be saved. The rope by which she delivered the messengers would be the same rope that delivered Rahab and her loved ones. What might this red rope represent?

Read carefully the words of the spies: "So it shall be that whoever goes outside the doors of your house into the street, his blood shall be on his own head, and we will be guiltless. And whoever is with you in the house, his blood shall be on our head if a hand is laid on him" (v. 19).

Like the Passover blood on the Israelites' doorposts that indicated their trust in God's mercy, the red rope symbolized Rahab's covenant with Joshua through his messengers. This is the story of salvation! It is through faith that we cling to the red "rope" of Christ's sacrifice for sin and escape eternal death.

When Joshua and his troops later came to Jericho, they marched around the city 13 times—once each day for six days. On the seventh day they marched around the city seven times. Then they blew the trumpets, shouted, and the walls fell down flat (see Joshua 6).

There were probably many people hiding in their houses when those mighty walls fell. Was it enough to be saved? No. Just as the Israelites needed the blood of the lamb on the doorposts of their homes for the angel of judgment to pass over them, so it was crucial to be in Rahab's house with the red rope in the window when the walls came down.

The spiritual significance of this story is multifaceted. Not only does it tell the story of salvation, but it also has practical

application for Christians today. Does it matter if we gather in God's house? Yes! It's very important, as we approach the end of time, that we do not forsake the assembling of ourselves together. If we do not have enough faith to get us to church once a week, how can we expect to have enough faith to get to heaven?

As soon as Rahab sent off the spies, she didn't delay a moment and bound the scarlet line in her window (Joshua 2:21). She made certain that her salvation was secure before she spread the news to her family.

Now, back to our spies. After three days of hiding in the mountains, the two men returned to their camp and reported to Joshua, "Truly the LORD has delivered all the land into our hands, for indeed all the inhabitants of the country are fainthearted because of us" (Joshua 2:24).

The spies knew they were going to win the battle because the people in Jericho had lost heart. They did not come back and report on Jericho's fortifications, armaments, or soldiers. Instead, they said, "The Lord's going to give Jericho to us because we have faith and they don't." Remember, we are saved by grace

PROPHECY WATCH THE POPE STRIVING TO BUILD BRIDGES, FULFILLING ANCIENT PROPHECY

he photo was a stunner: Pope Francis, one day after his March 19, 2013, inauguration as leader of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics, happily greeted General Linda Bond, at the time the international leader of The Salvation Army, a very Protestant organization. It was during a reception at the Vatican attended by dozens of leaders representing many Christian and non-Christian religions.

For most of the past five centuries, ever since Martin Luther posted his arguments against Catholicism in 1517, the idea of a pope and a Protestant leader smiling and greeting each other was as likely as oil mixing with water. Things are changing now, however.

The world's secular press noted the cordial tone of Francis'

welcome. He promised "friendship, respect and continued dialogue" to leaders of non-Catholic faiths during the Vatican meeting, even praising the Eastern Orthodox churches, which split from Rome a thousand years before. He had kind words for Jewish and Muslim leaders. And while *The New York Times* said the "symbolism of the event outweighed the substance," the newspaper also took note of Francis' conciliatory

tone at the event. After all, the paper said, Francis' predecessor, the now-emeritus Pope Benedict XVI, had "made several high-profile decisions and statements that inflamed Jews and Muslims."

About 18 months later, the pope explained his high opinion of the evangelical movement. As a four-year-old boy growing up in Argentina, the young Jorge Mario Bergoglio was walking with his grandmother when they saw two Salvation Army women in their distinctive uniforms. Were they nuns, he asked his grandmother. "No, they are Protestants, but they are good," she replied.

"This," said Pope Francis, "was the first sermon I ever heard about ecumenism, and [it] has influenced me in my ecumenical walk."²

And what a walk it's been! One of the pope's unofficial titles—it's carved into Roman buildings, however—is "pontifex maximus," or "supreme bridge-builder." Indeed, Francis uses @Pontifex as his Twitter name, which is followed by 6.69 *million* people as of July

2015. "Supreme bridge-builder" might not be an official title for this pope, but he appears to believe it's an important one!

UNPRECEDENTED OUTREACH

For most of the many centuries in which there's been a "supreme pontiff" in Rome, cordiality has not been a hallmark of the Vatican's relations with other religious groups, especially the dissidents known as Protestants. After all, the very name "Protestant" derives from those protesting the policies of the Roman church. Martin Luther answered a threatening edict from Pope Leo X by writing, "I ask thee, ignorant Antichrist, dost thou think that with thy naked words thou canst prevail

against the armor of Scripture?"

That's not exactly the most friendly of responses, is it? Then again, Leo, in writing to Frederic III, the Elector of Saxony, had called Luther a "son of iniquity." There was, in those days, no love lost between the sitting pope and those who dissented from his views. In that same message, Leo referred to "the old heresies of the Wyclifites, Hussites and Bohemians, already

condemned by the universal Church."

During those five centuries after Luther, Protestantism grew and eventually became a global force. The lamps lit by Wycliffe, Hus, the Waldensians and, yes, Luther and Calvin, spread the heart of the Christian message. By the mid-19th century, there were millions of hearts eager to hear an undiluted presentation of the gospel and Bible prophecy.

Though the late 18th and early 19th centuries had significant setbacks for the papacy, including the 1798 capture of Pope Pius VI by French General Louis Alexandre Berthier and the effective end of Italy's so-called Papal States when Italian King Victor Emmanuel II took action against Pius IX, the Vatican maintained its tough stance against those who would not submit to Rome.

Although the attitude began to soften under John XXIII and his successors—in January 1964, Pope Paul VI met

Orthodox Patriarch Athenagoras in Jerusalem in a major step in healing the thousand-year rift between the two communions—it wasn't until Pope John Paul II's tenure, which began 14 years after that Jerusalem encounter, that the thaw truly began. John Paul II was the first pope to visit a Jewish synagogue, and he was actively engaged with leaders of many religions, receiving Protestant evangelist Billy Graham "several" times, for example.

In March of 2000, already suffering the ravages of illness, a then-79-year-old John Paul II apologized to many who'd felt the Vatican's sting: "We are asking pardon for the divisions among Christians, for the use of violence that some have committed in the service of truth, and for attitudes of mistrust and hostility assumed towards followers of other religions."

FRANCIS UPS THE ANTE

Pope Francis, however, has dramatically increased efforts at reconciling with other religions, particularly Orthodox and Protestant leaders. His friendliness to other religious leaders is often matched by dramatic action. In May 2014, Francis visited Israel in part to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Paul VI/Athenagoras meeting that broke the ice between Rome and the Orthodox churches. In July 2014, two popular American television preachers, Kenneth Copeland and James Robison, met with Francis at the Vatican, with Robison giving the pontiff a "high five" after the pope's greeting.

Francis, for his part, is willing to "accept" evangelicals within a broader Christian framework: "I'm not interested in converting Evangelicals to Catholicism. I want people to find Jesus in their own community. Let's be about showing the love

of Jesus," Britain's *Catholic Herald* magazine quoted him as saying.⁴ The magazine noted that a joint finding of common ground in "justification by grace" in 1999 between Catholic and Lutheran leaders meant "the protest is over."

Perhaps the most dramatic gesture by Pope Francis so far came on June 22, 2015, when for the first time a Roman Catholic pontiff visited a Waldensian congregation during a visit to Turin. The Waldensian movement was founded in 1200 by Peter Valdo, and eventually many of its members were executed for "heresy" because they rejected Rome's teachings.

According to the Catholic News Agency, Francis declared, "I ask forgiveness for the non-Christian ... attitudes and behaviors which, through history, we have had against you. In Jesus Christ's name, forgive us!"⁵

That June declaration likely will not be the last time we hear from Pope Francis on getting along with other religions. The papal "supreme bridge-builder" will be the first in history to address a joint meeting of the U.S. Congress in late September. While his exact words are not known at press time, it's widely expected Francis will call for reconciliation among disagreeing political factions. Might a call for religious unity not be far behind? "And I saw one of his heads as if it had been mortally wounded, and his deadly wound was healed. And all the world marveled and followed the beast" (Revelation 13:3).



ould you look into your heart right now and respond to a very personal but important question? Do you judge yourself to be stronger in the things of God than you have ever been before? I hope so. Every day with Jesus should be sweeter than the day before. Each moment should find us moving up in our experience with a deeper faith.

Yet no one should be satisfied that God has finished His work of growth in his or her life. This very moment He wants to lead us deeper into the waters of surrender and consecration. There are still victories to be won, sins to be put away, and a drawing together that needs to be accomplished by the Holy Spirit.

Does God really mean what He says in the promises of Romans 6? No other chapter of the Bible is so lavish in

giving assurance to a struggling Christian. Consider these extravagant phrases:

"Shall we continue in sin? ... God forbid" (verses 1 and 2).

"We that are dead to sin" (v. 2).

"Henceforth we should not serve sin" (v. 6).

"Freed from sin" (v. 7).

"Dead indeed to sin" (v. 11).

"Let not sin therefore reign" (v. 12).

There is nothing ambiguous about these promises. Is there some secret meaning that might not apply to us? We are often tempted to believe so because of the element of certainty in every verse.

Some are frightened simply because it describes the perfect work God wants to do in sanctifying us from sin. Many

are afraid of that word "perfect." They are fearful that God will ask them to do something they are not willing to do.

Of course, God will never coerce our will into taking any action to which we have not given consent. But now we come face to face with the basic weakness that has led millions into discouragement and defeat. They simply have not been reconciled to giving up the enjoyment of their sins. There is a certain shallow, short-lived pleasure in sin that dances over the emotions and seeks to capture the mind through our sensory pathways. In every case there must be a decision of the will to forfeit those temporary "pleasures of sin for a season." Until that choice is made and acted upon, there can be no real victory over sin.

Are you prepared to accept the results of a complete surrender to Christ? I am convinced that there are only two possible reasons for a person holding back. Either he or she is not willing to give up the enjoyment of the sin or else does not believe that God can give deliverance from it. Being willing, of course, is our problem, but seeing it done is God's part alone. We must be willing, but we can never be able. Let us look at two mental blocks that have stolen victory from so many of God's people.

Self: The Greatest Enemy

Self is our greatest enemy. Once we have settled the score with that old man of the flesh who seeks to rule over us (Romans 6:6), all the other victories will come in their course.

God has given every one a powerful and personal weapon to use in combating the self. The will is our only natural reserve weapon; everything depends on the right action of this resource. We become whatever we choose to be. We are not what we feel or what we might do or say in a single impulsive moment. We are what we will to be. We cannot always control our emotions, but we can control our will.

It is not your fleeting feelings that make you a child of God, but the doing of God's will. Perhaps you had a headache when you woke up this morning, but does that change the fact that God loves you? Does it alter the truth of the Sabbath? No. Whether you feel good or bad, the truth remains the same.

However, we must recognize that our will and God's will, at some point, must come into collision. Either we let Him have His way or we choose our own course. And when it happens, many are not willing to admit the true cause behind the raging conflict.

I have heard hundreds of "reasons" for not going all the way with Christ. Some cite work or the opposition from relatives. But none of these are the true reasons; it goes much deeper. The truth is that God wants something that self is not willing to give up. They love something more than they love God.

In Matthew 16:24, Jesus says, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me"? Why didn't He specify the sins we're to deny? He knew that self was behind every battle. Once that victory is gained, all other victories will be won also.

Many thousands are in the church and are miserable because something in their life has been fighting the will of God for years. Yet to be a true Christian requires surrender.

Do you recall a time that your desire and God's will met in conflict? There was a titanic struggle. The old self resisted every impulse to turn away from sin. Under deep conviction you wrestled and agonized to no avail, until, finally, you surrendered your will and the battle was over. Peace flooded into your heart and glorious victory was realized.



What happened? Did you finally manage to drive back the devil? Definitely not. Your battle was with self, but when you became willing, God gave you the victory. "Thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:57). It might sound foolish to the world, but before you can live, you must die; before you have the victory, you must surrender.

Is Trying the Answer?

We also need to admit that we fight a spiritual enemy who is stronger than we are. In the weakness of our flesh, we struggle to extricate ourselves from the bondage, but the harder we try the deeper we sink into the mire. When we are totally exhausted from the effort, a well-meaning friend comes by and advises, "You need to try harder."

If that is the only answer we have to the sin problem, we're in trouble. Millionaires will give away all their wealth and

spend the rest of their life feeding on scraps—all in an effort to earn salvation. But "trying harder" will not break the chain of sin. Why? Because we are brought into this life with inherent weaknesses that predispose us toward sin. Furthermore, we have all yielded to those propensities. Jesus is the only One who never gave in to those weaknesses. He lived a totally sanctified life of obedience.

We do not need instruction in theology to acquaint us with the facts about our fallen nature. All of us have struggled with memories of failure and compromise. We have desperately tried to blot out scenes of unfaithfulness from our minds, but every such effort has ended in defeat.

Some time ago, a holy man in India traveling from village to village laid claim to a special creative power. As a result of his Himalayan pilgrimage, this sadhu professed to hold the secret for making gold. He would fill a large caldron with water and then stir the contents vigorously while uttering his sacred incantations. But in the process of stirring, he slyly slipped some gold nuggets into the water without being detected.



The headman of one village wanted to buy the secret for making gold, and the holy man agreed to sell it for 500 rupees. After explaining the stirring and the prayers to be repeated, the priest took his 500 rupees and started to leave. Then he turned back and gave a final word of warning. "When you are stirring the water and uttering the prayers, you must never once think of the red-faced monkey, or the gold will not come!"

As you can imagine, the headman never could make the formula work, because every single time he stirred the water, there was the red-faced monkey sitting at the edge of his mind, grinning at him.

Likewise, we have no natural ability to keep our thoughts and imagination under control for the simple reason that they are rooted in our sinful natures. Only when the mind has been



regenerated through the process of conversion can we subdue it and bring it under the control of the Holy Spirit. Only in this way may the intents of the heart be brought into harmony with Christ. Without the transforming grace of the new birth, "the carnal mind ... is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be" (Romans 8:7).

For three years I studied the language in India under the tutelage of a Hindu priest who came to my house daily. This gave me the opportunity to ask questions about various aspects of Hindu worship. Only after many months of classroom camaraderie did I feel clear in asking my teacher about one puzzling feature of his religion. "Why," I asked, "did most all the temples have obscene carvings all over the front of the buildings?"

My pundit seemed shocked and denied that any such carvings existed, but I invited him to walk down the street a block or two where a new temple was being constructed. The teacher could not deny the obscenities were there. But once again he professed surprise and stated that he had never seen anything like it before. He would find out the reason for it and tell me the next day.

On the following afternoon, I asked him about the carvings again. "Oh, yes," he said, "I found out why they put them on the front of temples. You see, when the people go in to worship the gods they are not supposed to think of those evil things, so we place the carvings to remind them not to think of those things while worshiping inside."

I chuckled at his explanation, realizing that none of us need reminding about the intrusion of such thoughts. Without the restraining power of God, they are ever with us. What we need is divine grace to subdue and conquer them. The mind renewed by Jesus Christ holds the only answer to both the inside and outside factors that lead to true victory.



hen the witnesses of a baptism are themselves drawn into the water just to be near the miraculous power of the Holy Spirit in those being baptized, something extraordinary is happening! 

How can I make my faith in God stronger?

Faith is a word we don't typically use in our everyday vocabulary; it's often relegated to the field of theology. However, everyday faith should be the foundation of our walk with God. Simply put—faith is trusting in the Lord. Every time you sit in a chair, you have "faith" that it will hold you up and not collapse beneath you. Faith is trusting that God will hold you up through the thick and the thin.

Many people have strong faith when everything is going well in their lives, but when a storm comes through, they lose their grip on God. It reminds me of a simple illustration from the field of aviation. As a pilot, one of the expressions I'll sometimes use is "flying blind." It means that when your outside visuals are obliterated by clouds, bad weather, or darkness, you fly the airplane solely by the instruments. It's a bit scary when you first learn to trust what's on the panel in front of you and not worry about the darkness outside. But without faith in your instruments, you are destined to crash and burn!

Exercising trust in God when things are dark and gloomy helps our faith grow stronger. As we develop a relationship with Jesus through daily Bible study and prayer, we learn that He truly loves us and has our best interests in mind. "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope" (Jeremiah 29:11). The more we come to know of God's love, the more we'll trust Him.

Every Christian is given a measure of faith by God (Romans 12:3). It's amazing what even a little faith can do. Remember, Jesus said, "If you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you" (Matthew 17:20).

How do I start doing what God wants me to do when I don't really want to do it?

Once we know what God wants us to do, we need to take action and do it.

Remember, though, that no one can make themselves ready to serve God.

Only God can make you ready to do His will. Pray, then, that He makes you willing to obey, to be filled with His love, and for His Spirit to work in your life. Then choose to obey Him right away!

Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!'" (Matthew 7:21–23). Many feel they will be saved at Jesus' return, but they will, instead, be lost because they haven't obeyed God. They haven't known Jesus as their Friend or kept His commandments. They've only followed their feelings.

For the safety of our souls, we should never depend solely upon feelings, because they are often deceiving. The devil can even influence our feelings. So if we depend on our feelings alone, he can more easily lead us on a destructive path. God would guide us through the unchanging words of Scripture. Our feelings, which can change on a whim, often lead us astray. Never listen to anything that contradicts the Holy Bible.

through faith alone (Ephesians 2:8). However, if that faith is real, it will be demonstrated by our actions.

Faith for Today and Tomorrow

Let's look ahead a bit further. The Israelites were getting ready to blow the trumpet, the wall was about to fall, and everyone in Jericho was going to be destroyed. Joshua, who represents Christ, had some final words of counsel for them:

"The city shall be doomed by the LORD to destruction [a representation of the second coming], it and all who are in it. Only Rahab the harlot shall live, she and all who are with her in the house [a symbolism of God's church], because she hid the messengers that we sent" (Joshua 6:17).

When the walls of Jericho fell, there was a mighty shout, trumpets blew, and a great quake shook the earth. It was a deliverance for God's people that the Bible says will be repeated in the future: "For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first" (1 Thessalonians 4:16).

Those two messengers sent from Joshua represent the Word of God, the law and the prophets. Like the two witnesses in Revelation and the sword with two edges, these two spies represent God's message of salvation found in the New and Old Testaments: "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee" (Psalm 119:11 KJV).

When Christ was nailed to the cross, a rope of blood flowed from His body. It's only those who have received His Word and are in the body of Christ when Jesus comes back that will be spared that final destruction. Only those who cling by faith to the "rope" of Christ's righteousness will survive.

Hang On

In 1936 the Germans built an enormous, 804-foot-long airship called the *Hindenburg*. As they were getting ready to maneuver the blimp into the hanger, about 100 men on the ground were hanging onto the zeppelin's ropes. Unexpectedly, the huge airship rose up with tremendous force.

As soon as it lifted, some of the men let go of the ropes, dropped to the ground, and didn't get hurt. Others waited until they were 50 or more feet off the ground before they let go, and when they fell they broke their ankles and legs. A few others panicked and instinctively tightened their grip. They went up with the

balloon but couldn't hang on forever. Their arms and hands grew weak, so they let go and fell to their deaths.

Soon the Hindenburg began to hover and drift with the breeze several hundred feet up. Yet one man remained hanging from the airship. The



people on the ground wondered how long he could last. They chased the *Hindenburg* for about three hours. Eventually it lost altitude, landed, and the lone man was able to let go and walk away.

The stunned onlookers asked, "How did you hang on for so long?" He replied, "Once the blimp took off, I tightened my grip. I soon realized that I couldn't hold on forever. So, while hanging on with one arm, I used my free arm to wrap the remaining rope around my waist and then tied a knot. For three hours I just hung there, trusting the rope, and enjoyed the view!"

Rahab's red rope is ultimately a symbol of faith. We must tie a knot in the promises of God and hang on. It is also a symbol of the blood of Christ. We have to tie the rope in our window, then tell our friends and family to get into the house, because Joshua (Jesus the Savior) is coming back soon with an army of angels to deliver those who have stretched out a red rope of faith, just like an unlikely hero named Rahab.
